

CLOCK HOURS AVAILABLE FOR READING CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS OF THE 2007 WASHINGTON STATE ASSOCIATION OF SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS FALL CONFERENCE

In addition to clock hours for attending the Fall 2007 Conference of the Washington State Association of School Psychologists, there are also clock hours available for reading the **2007 Conference Proceedings**.

The “**Conference Proceedings**” are articles provided by many of the presenters at the 2007 conference and are relevant to the field of school psychology and special education.

Reading articles from the Conference Proceedings will be worth 1-3 clock hours each. These clock hours are in addition to clock hours received through attendance at the conference. **The total number of clock hours is 22.**

You do not have to be a school psychologist or a member of the association to read the articles and be granted clock hours.

Fees: \$1 per clock hour for WSASP Members (if you attended the 2007 Fall WSASP Conference, you are a member). \$4 per clock hour for non-members. (WSASP Membership is \$60 and available at www.wsasp.com).

You do not have to read all the articles to participate in this clock hour opportunity; if you do not wish to read all the articles you may receive less than the total clock hours available.

Enrollment

Here is how you enroll to see the reading materials and to take the quizzes. The process is easy!

All reading materials and quizzes are found on “Blackboard” at the Eastern Washington University website. To register, go to www.ewu.edu, follow the “Blackboard” link on the right side of the page. Then follow the “Create Account” link.

You will be directed to the “Create New Account” page. Enter information to create a user account.

Section 1 - Personal Information. This is your real name and email address. SKIP THE “STUDENT ID” BOX. YOU DO NOT HAVE TO BE AN EWU STUDENT TO USE THIS SYSTEM.

Section 2 - Account Information. Create any username and password you want. You will use this to login to the system in the future to take the quizzes.

Section 3 – Other Information. You do not have to complete anything in Section 3.

Press “Submit” at the bottom of the page.

On your personal “Welcome” page, at the top left side are two tabs. Press the red colored “Courses” tab. Use the “Course Search” box to search for the class. Type “**proceedings**” or “**WSASP**” into the search box and you will find the class you are looking for: “30th Annual Washington State Association of School Psychologist Conference – Proceedings 2007.”

(You will also find the link to the Proceedings from the 2006 Conference, that are available as well: Proceedings of the 29th Annual Washington State Association of School Psychologist Fall Convention – October 2006”. You may enroll in this 2006 class, read the articles and received clock hours as well. The 2006 readings are not available on line but may be obtained by check or purchase order for \$25 to WSASP, from Steve Hirsch, Ph.D., Department of Education, WSU Spokane, P.O. 1495, Spokane, WA 99210-1495).

Click on the “Enroll” link and you are officially registered. The next time you come back to the Blackboard link, follow the “User Login” to gain access.

Once you are registered you can start reading the articles and taking quizzes at anytime. You do not have to take all the quizzes in order to participate in this clock hour opportunity and credits will be awarded when you have finished.

Claim Clock Hours: To claim your clock hours, print the clock hour claim form, and write a check for \$1 for each clock hour you earned. Check are payable to WSASP since WSASP is the clock hour provider.
