Requirements:

1. Valid Washington State ESA certificate with endorsement in school psychology.
2. Participation in a supervised practicum in both counseling and school psychology.
3. Familiarity with general areas of elementary curriculum and school organization.
4. Experience using principles of behavior modification, conducting test administrations and interpretation.
5. Familiarity with federal and state law regarding education for individuals with disabilities.
6. Experience working with children of various handicapping conditions, designing appropriate school programs, and developing strategies for program modification.
7. Ability to work with a team.
8. Bilingual English/Spanish preferred.
9. Background check, fingerprinting, and sexual misconduct disclosure release required.

Duties and Responsibilities:

1. Conduct psychological assessments, which include summary and formative analyses.
2. Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of developmental stages of children, including appropriate learning activities and behavioral expectations.
3. Write appropriate long-range placement goals based on assessment information.
4. Coordinate the process of placing students in special education by appropriately defining and diagnosing handicapping conditions.
5. Consult and assist in the development and maintenance of the Individualized Education Program (IEP).
6. Consult with parents and private and public practitioners regarding assessment findings and students' progress.
7. Work constructively with case study team members, special education teachers, principals, and other staff specialists.
8. Manage the process of designing and implementing learning programs, including developing appropriate strategies for maintaining classroom control and discipline.
9. Demonstrate awareness of current psychological techniques, test instruments, assessment procedures, and learning materials.
10. Knowledge of state and federal rules affecting students with disabilities.
11. Other related duties and responsibilities as assigned.

Training and Knowledge Desired:

1. Ability to plan and carry out appropriate individualized assessment to meet the varied needs of students, including utilization of appropriate diagnostic information, writing of short-and long-range goals and objectives, and developing behavior analyses/management plans.
2. Understanding and utilization of individualized education programs.
3. Ability to establish and maintain positive relationships with students, parents, colleagues, and classified personnel.
