We had 10,000 in a savings account that had to be moved over to a regular account to cover all our expenses. we were down to 1300 which is the lowest we've been. The 10K had been reserved for a project for Laree that has now been put on hold, not cancelled!

We still have things to pay for for next year. The retreat will be 6K and we need to pay our office staff. We will be fine but cannot support new projects. Next year will be a tight budget. After the conference in November we can have a new meeting to reassess. So there will be two budgets next year.

Professional Development Committee Report

Last year we lost 9K at summer institute. If we cancel it costs us 8K. If we have a virtual conference instead we might make 3-4K. Perhaps this summer we could have two strands: One secondary and one preschool.

We continue to include social justice as a component of ethics questions or concerns that are addressed to this chairperson, though none have been received since last fall.

Big Celebration: HB 1305 which proposed to change timelines among other things, we advocated against it, directly impacting 2 amendments, and ultimately it was not voted on by the House, so is dead for this session.

The committee continues to monitor more legislation as bills that made it this far still alive are now going through the other chamber.


